WETZEL / TYLER (W/T) HEALTH DEPARTMENT PROPERTY SALE

District Superintendent Neil Leftwich and Pastor Jeff Kanode have approved a special-called church conference to vote on the issue of selling the Wetzel/Tyler Health Department a piece of NMUMC property at the south end of the NMUMC parking lot for the purpose of building a new facility for the W/T Health Department. The negotiated sale price is \$125,000.

The vote will be held April 6, 2025, immediately following the first service, at 10:00 a.m. in the Sanctuary of New Martinsville United Methodist Church. All members of NMUMC are eligible to vote.

Wetzel / Tyler (W/T) Health Department Property Sale Fact Sheet.

In November of 2023, we were approached by the W/T Health Department about potentially selling them a piece of our property at the south end of our parking lot for the purpose of building a new facility for the W/T Health Department. After research on the property lines and negotiations with the W/T Health Department, NMUMC Trustees offered (upon approval of the Northern District and a vote from a NMUMC Charge Conference), to sell approximately 1.22 acres at the south end of the parking lot. A plot of the proposed property is attached. The sale price would be \$125,000.

We have over 7 acres in the Church property which is much more than we can ever foresee needing.

The benefits to NMUMC are:

The receipts from the sale would be applied to the Church mortgage current balance of \$804,632.29, saving us over \$200,000 in payments over the remaining life of the loan and would repay the loan 2 years earlier (May 25, 2033).

Partnering with W/T Health Department would be an extension of NMUMC's community service as the location is better located for W/T Health in serving the members of the community and would serve as part of NMUMC's outreach to the disadvantaged in the local community.

We could partner with the W/T Health Department in public health efforts, especially to the disadvantaged in the area.

The WV United Methodist Conference has been emphasizing us to include health activities in our community service efforts and partnering with the W/T Health Department could help improve service and volunteers to assist.

Visitors to the W/T Health Department would increase traffic to the Church.

Sale of the property would decrease the amount of property upkeep for NMUMC.

The W/T parking area would give us overflow parking for NMUMC services and events.

Disadvantages to NMUMC:

The property sold to W/T would no longer be available for additional Church facilities.

Benefits to the W/T Health Department are:

Our location is within walking distance (less than a mile) of four apartment complexes, which are low-income housing (two are across Route 2 from us).

Our location is within walking distance of a large trailer park on both sides Route 2

Our location is less than a mile from Wetzel County Hospital and the Ambulance garage

We are a designated emergency center for Wetzel County Emergency Management, Genesis Nursing Home, the Red Cross, and an organization that is confidential.

We have a large gymnasium that can be used for events or activities that require more space.

We are near the major shopping area of Wetzel & Tyler County.

We have a food bank open 9 – 1 on weekdays that would bring more traffic of disadvantaged people to the site.

Catholic Charities has a food bank once a month and our parking lot is used for overflow of the line of vehicles for food generating extra traffic for our facility and the site. Special events could be timed with their food bank day to serve more people.

We are in the process of acquiring an emergency generator so normal operations could continue during power outages.

We are just a few hundred yards off Route 2.

We would share our parking area to give overflow parking space for W/T Health Department use.

FINANCIAL UPDATE



NMUMC has met our financial needs to date for 2025. Through February 28, 2025, income exceeded expenses by \$3,548.65. February income exceeded expenses by \$1,583.83. We didn't pay the January or February portion of the Conference Fair Share due to trying to resolve an issue with conference concerning the Pastor's health insurance. We are waiting for a reply from the Conference. Our budget working balance is \$53,909.92.

As of February 28th, the 2025 Building Fund loan payments and expenses exceeded contributions by \$4,466.25. February loan payments exceeded contributions by \$1,330.10. The building fund balance

as of February 28, 2025, is \$49,735.87. The remaining balance of the Church loan as of February 28, 2025, is \$806,954.33. The payment schedule currently shows the loan will be paid in full May 18, 2035.

The Trustees have received substantial payments from the royalties on oil and gas rights endowed to NMUMC that can be used for loan payments if necessary and help us with capital project expenses.

NMUMC appreciates your support of our ministries through your budget and building fund contributions.

MISSION & OUTREACH

The Souper Bowl Challenge results total of 138 cans of soup and 4 crackers. Little Lambs 75 soup and congregation 63. Thank you for your numerous donations during the month of March. We appreciate your assistance as we help those in the community.

The Gifts of Grace Room is in need of children sizes of underwear, bath & hand towels, silverware, and laundry detergent.

In March, total households served was 43, with a total of 183 individuals benefitting from the food received from the pantry. Of the 43, 17 were new registers. Each box has approximately \$140 in nonperishable and frozen meat (totaling \$6,020). We have several from NMUMC and others in the community filling the three blessing boxes around the community with grab and go type food such as peanut butter crackers, pudding cups, etc. (approximately \$1,000 in food items); continued to fill the Library box with Christian books/Bibles, which is located at the west end of our parking lot. In cooperation with Catholic Charities and Community Resources, we assisted four individuals with gasoline (\$107) for doctor appointments, ten families with utilities (\$1,424).

Received 2 bottles of laundry detergent from Gifts of Grace contributions. Received a bag of sneakers from a family. Received 2 tablet covers and 18 spoons from a family. Received an electric stove from a family. Received a C/D player from a family. Received 4 bottles of dish detergent from Gifts of Grace contributions. Received 2 toasters, 3 cast iron skillets, plastic dishes, bowls, a foot bath, a shower grab bar, socks, glover, a box of household items, a humidifier, a set of pillow cases, 2 foot massagers, a box of decorative pillows, a baby rocker, 4 coffee makers, a portable air conditioner, silverware tray, a rotating waffle maker, and a toaster oven. Received 3 pillows, a comforter and a blanket from a family. Received a couch and a chair from a family. Received a full bed frame / mattress / box springs / 2 pillows / bedding, a couch, 2 dressers, a living room chair, an end table, 3 walkers, 2 table lamps, 2 table chairs, and 2 shower chairs from a family. Received a bed, dresser, couch, dresser, chest of drawers, 3 chairs, a wheelchair, a rollator, 2 pillows from an individual. Received a couch and a chair, and a stand from a family. Received a small grill and a package of grilling tools from a family. Received box of toys from a family. Received a can of Comet cleaner, a bottle of bleach, and 2 bottles of toilet cleaner from Gifts of Grace contributions. Received 2 bottles of shampoo from Gifts of Grace Contributions. Received a stuffed animal from a family. Received a refrigerator from a family. Received 2 bottles of laundry detergent and 23 bottles of glass cleaner from Gifts of Grace Contributions. Received a bag of plastic kitchen items from a family. Received 4 folding chairs from a family. Received a bottle of laundry detergent and a bottle of dish detergent from Gifts of Grace contributions. Received an ironing board from a family.

Provided a person a shower chair, a kitchen table, 2 easy chairs / 1 ottoman, 2 table chairs, an end table, a flat screen tv, a kitchen tray cart, 2 table lamps, a knife set with block, and 4 coats. Provided a person towels, wash clothes, sheets, a bed comforter, plastic bowls, kitchen utensils, cleaning supplies and grooming supplies. Provided a person pots, pans, cleaning supplies, laundry detergent and grooming supplies. Provided a family two chairs. Provided a individual a stand. Provided an individual a wheel chair.
